# On Point

A WATERFONT PROPERTY TAKES FULL ADVANTAGE OF ITS UNIQUE POSITION ON LONG ISLAND SOUND



**M**any of the properties covered in *CTC&G* deserve a second look. This 2016 IDA-winning design by Artemis Landscape Architects is one such project. Surrounded by water on three sides, the property commands sweeping views of Long Island Sound, a jetty and a creek. In the original article (July/August 2016), we examined a stunning invisible-edge pool area, a grouping of chairs and custom ipe planters, and a fire-table space alongside reconfigured sand dunes. Here, Tara M. Vincenta, company principal and founder, discusses the shade garden, which has dock access to the creek, plus an inviting upstairs spa entertainment level.

**Made In The Shade** The shade garden (ABOVE) boasts Janus et Cie Amari chairs and a Dedon Nestrest (OPPOSITE PAGE) that cleverly hides a generator. Metal edging (RIGHT) defines an organic curve at the edge of the permeable creekside terrace of wheaton granite and a custom peastone blend. **Upper Deck** (OPPOSITE PAGE, TOP) Dedon's City Camp swing provides seating alongside the spa in the upstairs entertainment area. *See Resources.*
